OzOnDeck

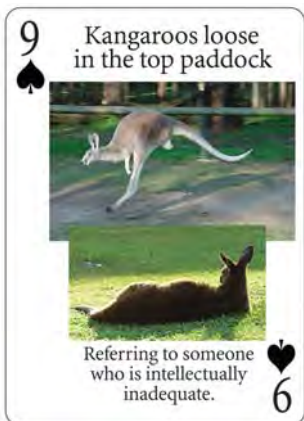
